PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Leo Dear

I have not been active in the tennis community during the past winter as I am waiting for good vision to return to my right eye after the corneal transplant I had last September. My doctor told me to be patient as it can take up to a year before good vision returns. However, I'll be back on the courts this summer - good vision or not.

I have been told by those hard working winter Court Captains that tennis under the bubble continued as enthusiastically as ever despite the fact that there were a few "no shows" some mornings. My thanks to those who successfully organized and ran the morning sessions, and to those who played each day.

Dennis Rothgaber, who manages STANS membership, reports that in late February, STANS had 230 Active members (many of whom have not yet rejoined for 2008), 16 Life members and 3 Corporate members. Combined Appliances is our new Corporate member, thanks to the entrepreneurial skills of Pam Bonetti and we welcome their support.

Kurt Peiffer who manages our finances, reports that on January 31, 2008 we had \$5,552.68 in our current account, although \$3,057.60 will shortly be taken from that account to pay West Van Tennis Club for our winter rental of the bubble courts. In addition, the amount in our Term Deposit was \$5,546.57.

Two of our Board members, Jane Cramond and Mavis Weston, have decided to retire from the Board and will not continue after our April AGM. Dennis Rothgaber is planning to move to Seattle in May or June of 2008 and will also retire at the AGM but has agreed to help the next person who handles membership take over the role smoothly. I wish to thank all departing members for the work they so cheerfully carried out during their time on the Board. STANS members Will Phillips, Alf Orr and Kirsty Milligan have agreed to fill the vacant positions and will stand for election at the upcoming Annual General Meeting. Let me also offer a gentle reminder to those who have not yet sent in their renewals for 2008, to

please do so. Renewal forms can be handed in or filled in together with your annual fee at the AGM if that is more convenient. You must be a paid up member to vote at the AGM.

Please make every effort to attend our Annual General Meeting on Tuesday April 8, 2008 as under our Constitution a quorum of at least 20 members is required in order for the meeting to proceed.



OVER THESE PAST MONTHS...

...several long time contributors to STANS have passed away.

On November 10, 2007, **Waring Pentland** passed away in North Vancouver. Waring was a long-time member and supporter of STANS and he drafted the first feasibility study that was the template for what turned out to be a successful initiative, the creation of the Grant Connell Tennis Centre. The North Shore Indoor Tennis Association grew out of that work and it spawned the North Vancouver Tennis Society that is now the public partner in the operation of the GCTC.

On December 3, 2007, **Frank Gartner** passed away and Betty Bishop prepared the following tribute: The tennis community of the North Shore lost a great friend and supporter with the death of Frank Gartner. He was one of the pioneers responsible for the development of tennis on the North Shore. In the early days he and Elmer Helm rented a trailer and had it installed at the old Capilano Club on Capilano road. I am sure some of you will remember playing there. He made sure it was staffed in order to collect fees to play in the bubble. He kept meticulous financial records which favourably impressed the municipalities and helped convince them of the need for tennis facilities in our area.

He also helped form the North Shore Tennis Association which eventually resulted in the construction of the Grant Connell Tennis Centre. He will be both remembered and missed.

On January 26, 2008, long time STANS member **June Cherry** passed away at home in the presence of her family. June was an active volunteer in the community, enjoyed cross-country ski outings during the winter months and could often be found on summer mornings at the Ambleside and Benbow tennis courts.

Betty Tyner passed away on February 23. She was pre-deceased by her husband, Ralph, in 2001. Betty and Ralph were active in STANS since its beginning and together organized the summer round-robin tennis and the Christmas tennis party for several years. They also participated in the STANS Bridge Group. Betty and Ralph loved their tennis and everyone loved them.






