US OPEN 2016 AS SEEN BY A STANS MEMBER John Kennedy

Harlem, Tuesday

August 30, 2016.

Day 2 of the 2016 US Open Tennis Championships. Dawn breaks and a heat wave insinuates



itself into the aging body of yours truly. We're off to the subway and then Penn Station to catch the Long Island Railroad for the forty-minute ride to Flushing Meadows and the tennis courts for an afternoon of exciting competition, crowds of enthusiastic New Yorkers from all over the world and lots of water to ward off heat stroke. I'm attending with youngest son Paul, daughter-in-law Krista and grandchildren Jack (8) and Phoebe (6) with whom I am spending what turns out to be a delightful 5 days in NYC.

Arrival and entry are remarkably easy to navigate. A pedestrian walkway leads to a multitude of gates with the usual security checks and about ten entry lines so we were inside in less than 20 minutes after leaving the train. Once inside, gawking is allowed and perhaps encouraged...the array of food options, offering pretty much anything your cholesterol level can manage, already going strong at 11:15...places to buy stuff with what I swear is the world's most boring selection of tennis wear (with the possible exception of a very cool shirt similar to one we were to see later worn by Verdasco). He's a good-looking guy and looked great in it, but lost to Wawrinka anyway. I would have looked not-so-great in it and would have had to put up with way

too many caustic comments on the North Shore courts. Saved about \$50 US with that decision.

We have tickets for this afternoon's play and we're going to try to get a taste of all the Open has to offer. The place is spread out with 17 outside courts and 6 practice courts plus the Grandstand, Louis Armstrong stadium (both offer close-up looks at the competitors) and Arthur Ashe stadium, (the largest and most steeply raked, putting those of us in the not-so-cheap seats a long way from the players). For us the competition begins with a look at Eugenie Bouchard who is playing well when we arrive but is eventually bested by her Czech rival Katerina Siniakova on the blistering hot Grandstand court. This is where Eugenie had her fall and consequent concussion last year. I hope her issues get sorted out. She's an impressive athlete.

We then head out for a bite to eat before going into Arthur Ashe to watch 3^{rd} seeded Stan Wawrinka beat Fernando Verdasco 7-6, 6-4, 6-4. That may sound like an easy win, but Wawrinka spent a heck of a lot of time glancing at his coach for support when shots went bad. We saw 6th seeded Venus Williams beat Ukraine's Kateryna Koslova in the same venue, then back to the Grandstand to watch 6th seeded Kei Nishikori give Benjamin Becker a tennis lesson. Then to Louis Armstrong for the del Potro vs fellow Argentinian Diego Schwartzmann match that del Potro won handily. Along the way we saw a bit of the Donaldson-Goffin match. David Goffin whom we first heard of and saw at the French Open in 2013 was seeded 12th here but lost anyway. He's one to watch. And another one to watch is the youngster from Montreal who won the Junior Boys Singles title here, Felix Auger-Aliassima. (Wawrinka won that title here in 2003.)

For those of you with short memories, Stan Wawrinka beat Novak Djokovic in the Men's Singles final for his third Grand Slam. He won Australia in 2014 and France in 2015. Three pretty good years, I'd say.

Sad News for the North Shore and Vancouver Tennis Community


